


#### **Board News & Updates**

#### **Protected Wetlands**

The Board has temporarily decided to hold off work on CIC Common Properties that have been designated as protected wetland by the Province of New Brunswick.

The edge of The Meadow falls within a wetland buffer zone so clearing there has been suspended.

More noteworthy is the fact that our Common Property at Mill Cove is designated as "Provincially Significant Wetland". Discussion about maintenance strategies and limitations will be on the agenda for the Annual Meeting on July 19.

#### **Underused Housing Tax**

If you own a house on the island and are not a Canadian citizen you need to file an Underused Housing Tax (UHT) return before April 30, 2025. UHT is an annual federal 1% tax on the ownership of vacant or underused housing in Canada that took effect on January 1, 2022. This does not apply to vacant land.

Because Campobello is in an area of Canada that is eligible for vacation property exemptions, it is likely that you will not have to pay tax if you use your house at least 28 days per calendar year. Nonetheless, a return must be filed.

#### The Quiet Months on Campobello

#### **Schooner Cove**

Schooner Cove is one of the jewels of the Campobello Island Club, cherished for its picturesque ocean beach which is nestled between craggy outcroppings on either end. This crescent shaped cove is a place for quite reflection, while listening to the waves lap gently across the rocky shore. It is also a spot for gathering, picnics, bird watching, and beach fires.

But access to the beach has been treacherous due to a steep drop of several feet, and unstable stairs to navigate it. Additionally, the rocks on the beach make it difficult for visitors, especially those with limited mobility, to gather for picnics. The board proposed making improvements and upgrades to the Cove to include replacing the stair railing to make it more secure, shoring up the rocks at the base of the stairs to provide a better platform to step onto, and building a picnic pavilion on the grassy area above the beach to provide a sheltered gathering space. At the 2024 Annual CIC Meeting members voted to in favor of these proposals.

Members Elisabeth and Warren Sandberg have recently taken the initiative to modify the railing. Warren generously donated his time to install a pressure treated post anchored 20 inches deep in concrete. He then extended the upper railing down to the base of the stairs.

Plans for the picnic pavilion are well under way. The first step is to clear the area, then prepare it for a poured concrete platform. This will be the foundation for a covered pavilion and picnic tables with benches. There will also be an inground-mounted barbecue grill. A request for bids will be made this spring, with projected completion of the project by midsummer.




